- 1919 Formed United Artists.
- 1921 Visited Europe. Was met by large crowds everywhere.
- 1924 Married Lita Grey.
- 1925–31 Made three of his best films – 'The Gold Rush', 'The Circus' and 'City Lights'. Didn't speak in a movie until 1936 (Modern Times) and then only sang one song.
- 1936 Married Paulette Goddard (divorced 1942).
- 1943 Married Oona O'Neill. Lived in USA 1913–52. Never became a U.S. citizen.
- 1952 Moved to Switzerland. Unpopular in USA because of his political opinions.
- 1957 Went to England. Made 'The King in New York', which wasn't shown in the U.S.A.
- 1966 To England again. Made 'Countess from Hong Kong' with Sophia Loren.
- 1972 Returned to Hollywood. Was given an Oscar.
- 1975 Went to London. Was knighted by the Queen. (Became "Sir Charles Chaplin, K.B.E.").
- 1977 25th December, died Vevey, Switzerland. Buried Corsier.
