PROTECTING HEDGEHOGS

Hedgehogs are nocturnal animals, which means that they sleep during the day and come out at night. They have very short legs, but they can walk very far. When they come out at night for food, they can walk more than 3 kilometres!

They have around 5,000 spikes and when they're scared, their spikes rise up to protect them. Hedgehogs eat mostly insects and bugs. One reason why hedgehogs are endangered is that when humans use pesticides to kill insects, there are fewer insects for the hedgehogs to eat.
